## **PROGRAM HIGHLIGHT - FOOD RESCUE PROGRAM**

One of the services that Olivet Neighborhood Mission has expanded since October 2019 is our **Food Rescue Program.** Although ONM had a box truck, it was not until we hired a driver to oversee pick up services that we were able to expand this program. Westley Starr was hired to take charge of daily pickups. We moved to early morning daily pickups at HACAP, so clients were able to get daily fresh items from our Kitchen Pantry. In addition, we took on pick ups from the Kum & Go's (1st Ave & 16th Ave) three times a week. In addition, Wes

does weekly pick ups at Great Harvest Bread, Target SW, Otter Creek Store (BP on County Home Rd) and Fareway (1st Ave). These additions have added much diversity and amounts of food that we are able provide to our neighbors.

As of the end of July 2020, Westley has picked up and delivered to ONM 529,729 pounds of food! Way to go Wes!

# A Note from the Director

Olivet Neighborhood Mission has been able to weather the events of 2020 due largely to upgrading our freezers and refrigerators to commercial models during the first six months of this year. It all started last Fall 2019 when we decided to write a grant from the Greater Cedar Rapids Community Foundation asking for funding for one 3-door commercial freezer and one 3-door commercial refrigerator. First picture, our need, we had as of January 2020 a hodgepodge of 7 or 8 residential freezers and refrigerators throughout Olivet Mission that encompassed 80 cubic foot of food storage while serving 3,000 unduplicated people per month. Our storage capacity did not match the need for the food we needed to store to serve our neighbors.



But we get to later March 2020 and we all find ourselves amid a state-wide shut down with COVID 19. Olivet Neighborhood Mission find ourselves among the essential services and never closes. We partner with the Green AmeriCorps and start putting food boxes together and deliver to those who are quarantined. Again, funding finds us, and we can purchase two additional 2-door freezers and one 2-door refrigerator. In a matter of six months' time, we grew our cubic foot food storage capacity from 80 to 287.88 cubic foot!

The importance of these purchases will again show itself when Derecho blew through our community on Monday, August 10th. With the use of a generator for 10 days due to widespread power outages, Olivet Neighborhood Mission hooked up those commercial freezers and refrigerators, and we lost nothing! No food was lost, and we continued to serve our neighbors in need! What a blessing!
